Annual OSPI School District Assessment Summary for the period ending May 2016

- ▶ Vision and Hearing screening K-7th (1,235 Students):
 - ▶ 51 vision referrals, 38 hearing referrals
- ▶ Management of 118 student medications: fire drills, field trips, sports participation, order changes, refills and medication expirations.
- ▶ Management of 972 documented health conditions-259 Health Care Plans.
- ▶ Management of 225 Potentially Life Threatening Health conditions.
- ▶ Students evaluated by the RN for health concerns: 836+
- ▶ Number of student visits to our Districts health rooms:
 - ▶ over 11,000
 - ▶ **9,556 documented returned to class!**

HIV/Growth and Development Education

Student Immunization Compliance

- ▶ Participated in Radio Program with Dr. Stehr-Green to give information about the measles outbreak- a county, school immunization and health review
- ▶ Improved student access by arranging for CCHHS to give a vaccination clinic at Timberwolf days Aug. 2015, and again at Timberwolf days this year.
- ▶ Attended a Clallam County School Nurse review of services at the invitation of CCHHS
- ▶ Agreed to an Immunization audit, and worked in collaboration with Dr. Chris Frank and his staff
- ▶ Performed a complete reverse audit on the results and reviewed those with Dr. Frank.
- ▶ Findings: Sequim School District compliance rate; **97%**
- ▶ Continued attendance at Kindergarten readiness, K registration and 6th grade parent nights.

Wellness Program

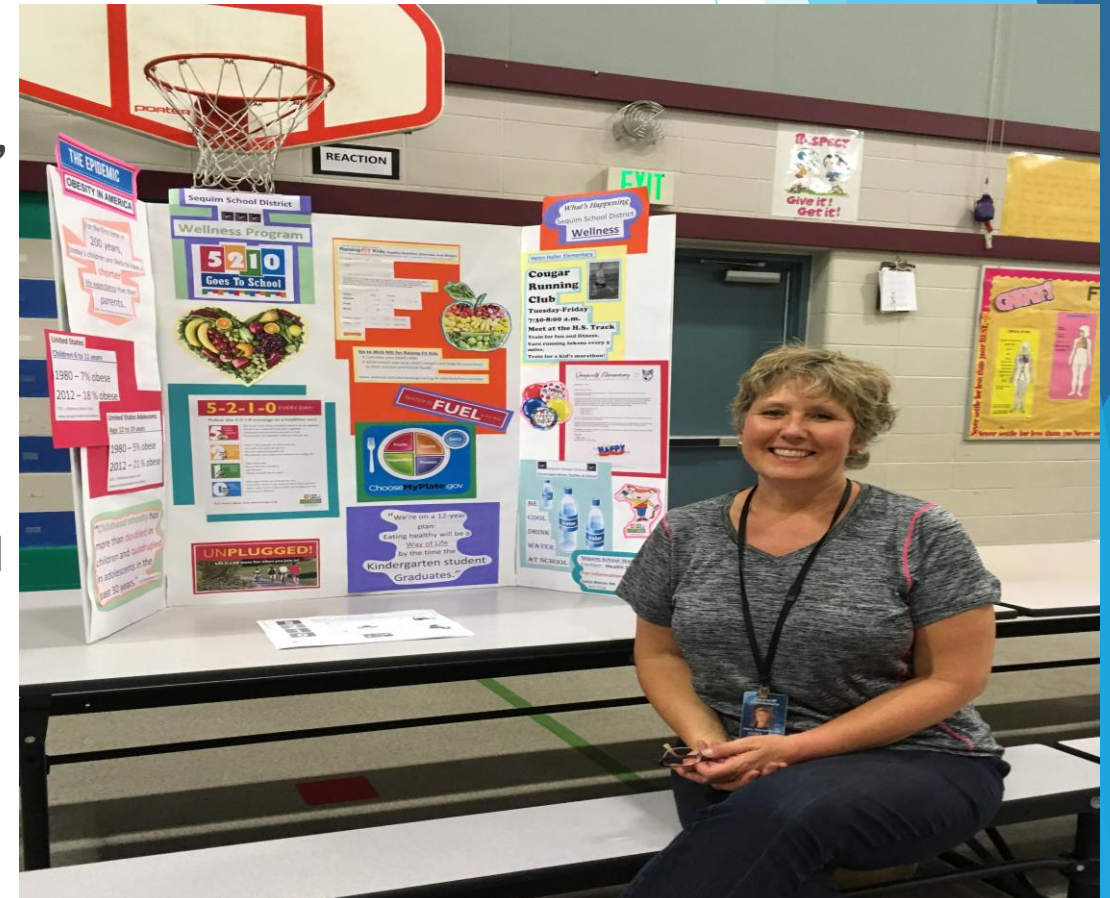
Coordinated the donation of the “5-2-1-0” Banners to the Sequim School District
