OUR PARTNERSHIP IS BASED ON A NUMBER OF LEGAL MANDATES

- ESSA
- Executive Order 13175 (2000)
- The Centennial Accord (1989) and other state mandates
- Treaty Rights as affirmed in numerous Supreme Court cases
- SB5433 (2015) Since Time Immemorial curriculum

ESSA PROVIDES A NUMBER OF AVENUES FOR PARTNERSHIP

- Title I, Title IIA federal government money flows to state and is disbursed by OSPI
- OSPI is governed by ESSA regulations, including Executive Order 13175 (Tribal Consultation)
- Title VI federal money flows directly to SSD
- Services for Titles I, IIA, and VI are coordinated, as per ESSA
- The Tribe provides direct Title VI services to students and families

CONSULTATION ON SEPTEMBER 8,2017

- One of the first School District-Tribal Consultations in our state that was initiated by the district
- Now creating an MOU to facilitate datasharing, professional development for Tribal/ district staff, and coordinated case management for children we share
- Increase effective identification and service for Title VI eligible children
- Manage transitions for students with Tribal help

OUTCOMES FOR OUR AMERICAN INDIAN/NATIVE AMERICAN/ALASKAN NATIVE STUDENTS NEED TO IMPROVE

- Can't share SSD grade band data because it is suppressed
- Research demonstrates AI/NA/AN students need wraparound support and assistance coordinated with the Tribe
- Culturally responsive instruction is important
- School and district improvement designations will consider AI/NA/AN outcomes in determining new schools for improvement status in 18-19
